

Pa QSO Party 2006

The 49th Annual running of the Pennsylvania QSO Party will be coming up in about 6 weeks, the second weekend in October, the 14th & 15th.

More information about the contest, and complete up-to-date rules for 2006 can be found at <http://www.nittany-arc.net/paqso.html>. There are many changes and updates this year, including the addition of RTTY and PSK-31 modes!

The Special Event (or Bonus) Station for this year's contest is N3SH, one of the club calls for the neighboring Wireless Association of South Hills. WASH will be operating multiple N3SH stations from multiple counties in order to maximize the number of potential bonus points available to everyone in the contest (each contact with N3SH is worth a 200 point bonus, and you can contact N3SH once per band/mode/county combination... it can add up quickly!). At present, there are plans to operate N3SH from Washington, Allegheny, Fayette, Clarion, Venango and Erie Counties, and there will also be N3SH Mobile running around too (operated by Ed N3ZNI and Dave K3LGM). Many of the N3SH stations will be operating on the new digital modes, and on VHF too. Certificates will be available for those contacting multiple N3SH stations, along with other memorabilia. A good time is planned for by all!

Interested, but don't have a lot of time that weekend, or not familiar with contest and/or HF operating? Not to worry... WASH is inviting any interested member of WACOM to join them in operating some of the N3SH stations, especially the Washington, Allegheny and Fayette County stations. There's plenty of room for everyone, so if you're interested, don't feel left out!

KB3FZU/R Shack Repair

On Saturday, August 18, 2006 Randy, N3ZK, Brian, KB3IFR, and I went to the 443.650 repeater shack with the intention of re-facing the left side and front exterior walls. Randy and I had done the right side last fall and I expected the job to take about 4 hours as Randy has all of the right tools to make a job like this go well. We started working at 3 PM. In a short amount of time we had the left face removed and replaced. Lori, KB3GMU, decided that the job would go quicker if we had pre-painted lumber, so while the T-11 siding was laying in storage she painted it! That helped tremendously.

Cue Mother Nature with the rain; a perfect time to break for dinner. When we returned, it was still threatening but we pressed on and removed the front of the shack. A cell phone rings and Brian needs to leave to attend to a problem. Randy removes the front and we notice that it is rotting about one foot up from the bottom. I decided that the best course of action was to completely rebuild the front wall. Randy told me that the door had seen better days ☺ and it would be much easier just to replace it. We called the local home improvement mega store and arranged to have a door waiting for pick up, as it was now nearing closing time (9 PM).


Randy stayed at the shack and continued demolition as I made the drive to pick up the materials. It was about this time that I realized we were going to be late. I called my newly licensed brother, Dave, KB3NCD, and had him drive to the shack to lend an extra pair of hands. He and Brian were on site when I returned, and Randy had made short work of the demolition. Randy also noticed that the front



part of the floor was beginning to rot and it would need to be replaced.

We cut out all of the rot and began the re-assembly process. With all of the help and some light that Randy and Brian provided, we were able to rebuild the front wall. We finished the job at 1 AM, just as it started to sprinkle. Mr. Murphy was definitely present on this job and the square time rule also applied.

I would like to thank Randy (and especially Mrs. Randy), Brian for staying with this project until it was done, and Dave for walking into this cold and staying until we had it under control.

Realizing this squirrel was as big as a cat and not happy, I decided it was time to be somewhere else.

In my haste to leave the area I slipped on the nuts and smashed the wooden chair I had been sitting on with all my 280 lbs of self.

I was still able to scoot through the door that I had to kneel down to get in to faster than any other man alive.

My foot missed the 5-gallon bucket I was using for a step. I landed flat on my back on the floor. The Giant Squirrel ran across my chest and burst through the heavy insulated shed door held shut with a bungee cord.

It was then I realized 3 things:

1. I was still wearing my headphones.
2. I still have a QSO in progress.
3. I just got my butt kicked by a squirrel.



WACOM e-Mail Reflector

An e-mail reflector has been set up for WACOM members.

What's a reflector? It's a mailing list which lets you send one e-mail message to the list address — wa3com@yahoogroups.com — and have it "reflect" to all members of the list. Unlike a personal mailing list, you don't need to know all of the e-mail addresses for every single member of the list. Only group members can send e-mail to other members of the reflector — no spam allowed!

E-mail reflectors are being used by many area Amateur Radio clubs as a means to facilitate news and information at a moments notice. Yahoo! Groups (formerly eGroups) provides this service for free to anyone who wants to avail themselves of their list server. Yahoo! also provides calendar, file storage, & additional services.
